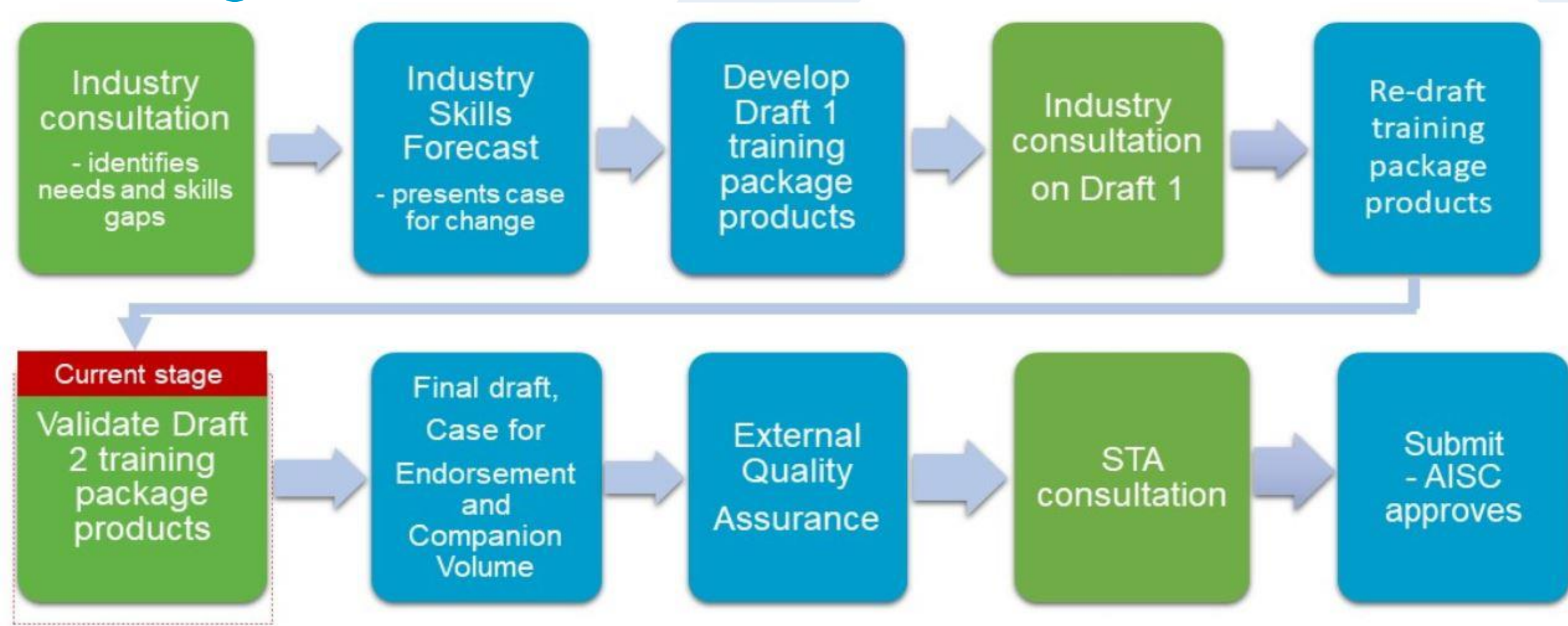

Stages of Review and Development of Training Packages



Project Background

The following key areas have been taken into consideration during the Training Package development process:

Digital Technologies

Digital competency and online engagement skills required for job roles on a day-to-day basis due to advanced digital technologies

Patient Interaction

The ability to communicate with a diverse range of individuals

Quality and Safety

Increased accountability for quality and safety procedures for all patients and staff

Leadership, Management and Administration Skills

Orthodontic Dental Assistance

Assisting with implants and in surgical procedures

Workforce Distribution

Access to suitable dental services and retention of dental assistants, especially in regional, rural and remote areas

Draft 1 – December 2019

- *Certificate III in Dental Assisting* – Eleven core Units required for attainment of Qualification
- *Certificate IV in Dental Assisting* – Thirteen core Units and four elective Units selected from the following elective specialisations:
 - *Group A – Dental Radiography*
 - *Group B - Oral Health Education*
 - *Group C - General Anaesthesia, Conscious Sedation and Relative Analgesia*
 - *Group D - Technical Records*
 - *Group E – Dental Practice Administration*
- Workshops in major cities
- Webinars and email consultation
- SkillsIQ Feedback Forum.

Draft 2 Key Changes – Certificate III in Dental Assisting

- The *Certificate III in Dental Assisting* Qualification has been updated to include eight core Units of Competency and a choice of two elective Units from a list of eight Units of Competency.
- Packaging Rules for Draft 2 have been updated to include ten Units of Competency required for attainment of the Qualification.
- Work placement hours have been updated to 350 hours, as per the Assessment Requirements of the Units of Competency.
- Draft 2 has been updated to include a list of eight elective Units.
- A new Unit, *HLTDEN030 Assist the operator during medical emergencies in a dental setting*, has been developed in response to feedback from Draft 1 public consultation and is included in the elective composition.
- Unit *CHCLEG001 Work legally and ethically* has been added to the elective list.

Draft 2 Key Changes – Certificate IV in Dental Assisting

- The *Certificate IV in Dental Assisting* Qualification has been updated to include two core Units of Competency with a choice of six elective Units of Competency.
- Packaging Rules for Draft 2 have been updated to include eight Units of Competency required for attainment of the Qualification.
- Packaging Rules have been updated to allow flexibility in the choice of elective Units of Competency.
- Work placement hours have been removed.
- Appropriate versions of the *Certificate III in Dental Assisting* Qualification have been added as an Entry Requirement.

Entry to this Qualification is open to individuals who have completed the following Qualifications:

- *HLT35015 Certificate III in Dental Assisting* and/or
- *HLT31812 Certificate III in Dental Assisting* and/or
- *HLT31820 Certificate III in Dental Assisting* and/or
- the equivalent.

- Draft 2 has been updated to include one specialisation, Dental Radiography.

Draft 2 – Updated Skill Sets

Two Skill Sets under the scope of this project have been updated:

Dental Radiography Skill Set

This Skill Set provides a set of skills for dental radiography work.

HLTDEN021 Apply the principles of radiation biology and protection in dental practice

HLTDEN022 Prepare to expose a prescribed dental radiographic image

HLTDEN023 Produce a prescribed dental radiographic image.

Oral Health Care Skill Set

This Skill Set provides a set of skills for promoting good oral health to clients and groups through the provision of visual oral health checks and educational and motivational information, including the demonstration of oral hygiene practices and techniques where appropriate.

HLTOHC008 Inform and support patients and groups about oral health

HLTOHC011 Apply fluoride varnish.

Draft 2 Key Changes – Units of Competency

- Draft 2 Units of Competency have been updated in terms of
 - ❑ Unit codes
 - ❑ Terminology - references to the following terms have been updated throughout all the Units of Competency, where applicable, for consistency.
 - ❖ References to 'medical records' and 'images' have been marked as 'de-identified' throughout all the Units of Competency, for consistency.
 - ❖ References to 'dentist' and 'dental specialist' have been replaced with 'practitioner'.
 - ❖ The following statement has been inserted into all the Units to acknowledge evidence of Foundation Skills: 'Foundation skills essential to performance are explicit in the Performance Criteria of this Unit of Competency'.
 - ❑ Performance Evidence, Knowledge Evidence and Assessment Conditions have been reviewed to ensure consistency and comprehension.
- A detailed Summary of changes from Draft 1 to Draft 2 is available on pages 6-11 of the Draft 2 Certificate III and IV in Dental Assisting Validation Guide.
- Detailed mapping information is available on pages 18-31 of the Draft 2 Certificate III and IV in Dental Assisting Validation Guide.

Certificate III in Dental Assisting

HLTDEN030 Assist the operator during medical emergencies in a dental setting

- ❖ Should this Unit of Competency be included in the core or should it remain in the elective section?

Certificate IV in Dental Assisting

HLTDEN023 Produce a prescribed dental radiographic image

- ❖ Should this Unit of Competency comprise extra-oral or intra-oral techniques or both?
- ❖ In Element 4, relating to OPG(Orthopantomagram): Should intra-oral be in radiography specialisation? If yes, where does extra-oral sit?

Certificate IV in Dental Assisting

Entry Requirements

❖ The following Qualifications have been included as Entry Requirements for the *Certificate IV in Dental Assisting* Qualification:

‘Entry to this Qualification is open to individuals who have completed the following Qualifications:

- *HLT35015 Certificate III in Dental Assisting* and/or
- *HLT31812 Certificate III in Dental Assisting* and/or
- *HLT31820 Certificate III in Dental Assisting* and/or
- the equivalent.’

❖ Should the entry requirements include any post-Qualification work experience hours?

Seeking Feedback from Industry Stakeholders on Draft 2

Qualification

- Do the Qualifications provide clear and accurate description of the skills outcomes for the Qualification?
- Are the Packaging Rules for the core composition of Units attainable at a Certificate III and IV level?

Skill Sets

- Do both the Skill Sets reflect the skill requirements for workers in the sector?
- Is the composition of Units suitable for workers seeking to broaden their skills?

Seeking Feedback from Industry Stakeholders on Draft 2 Units of Competency

Overview

- Are all draft Units required?
- Are there any essential prerequisites that should be nominated?
- Are there any additional Units of Competency required?

Elements and Performance Criteria

- Do the Elements and Performance Criteria accurately describe what people do in Dental Assisting job roles? If not, what could be added?
- Do the Performance Criteria adequately describe the level of proficiency?

Performance Evidence

- Is the suggested volume (sufficiency) of evidence appropriate? Too little, too much?
- Are the statements clear? Would assessors understand exactly what they must do?

Knowledge Evidence

- What is the essential knowledge required of an individual in order to perform the tasks described in the Performance Criteria? Is the Knowledge Evidence requirement specific enough?
- Is there anything which should be added or deleted?

Assessment Conditions

- Are the nominated environments appropriate?
- Are the statements clear? Would assessors understand what they must provide for assessment?

Public Consultation


- Open until 16th October 2020
- Consultation activities include Webinars and the SkillsIQ Online Feedback Forum
- Feedback to be considered by the Dental Assisting TAC and Dental IRC prior to submitting the Case for Endorsement.

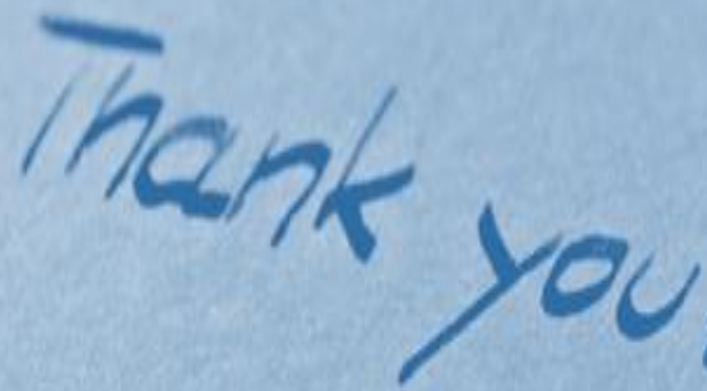
