SMART AND SKILLED UPDATE – NO. 188-191

December 2022

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1. CHANGES TO THE SMART AND SKILLED ENTITLEMENT FOUNDATION SKILLS PROGRAM

From 1 July 2023, Smart and Skilled foundation skills full qualification training will be funded under the Entitlement Full Qualification (EFQ) program – instead of the Entitlement Foundation Skills (EFS) program – for all new commencements from the 2023-2024 Activity Period onwards. There is no change to the EFS program arrangements for the 2022-23 Activity Period.

The change is intended to improve ease-of-access to foundation skills training for NSW students and result in simplified and more flexible funding and administration arrangements for providers.

a. What is changing?

 Qualifications in the EFS Program are currently available for funding to TAFE NSW and Department-approved ACE providers. Smart and Skilled-eligible Registered Training Organisations (RTOs), excluding non-government Enterprise-based RTOs but including the current EFS-approved providers, will be eligible to apply through the Smart and Skilled



Provider Application 2023-24 for funding under the EFQ program to commence students in foundation skills full qualifications from 1 July 2023.

- Funding for foundation skills full qualifications will be allocated through the Smart and Skilled Provider Application 2023-24 which commenced on 1 November 2022. Providers will be able to apply for foundation skills full qualifications as per the rules of the application process. The foundation skills qualifications and funding allocations for the 2023-24 Activity Period will be incorporated into the Entitlement Full Qualifications program.
- Foundation skills students who commence by 30 June 2023 will continue to be funded under the current EFS program in 2023-24 from a Financial Cap for Continuing Students only. For TAFE NSW and DOE-approved ACE providers currently allocated an EFS program Financial Cap, their EFQ Financial Cap allocation for 2023-24 will include the current EFS Financial Cap amounts less an amount retained in the EFS program to fund the teach out of continuing students.
- EFS Financial Cap allocations will shift from a program financial cap to (a) regional financial cap(s). Where a Provider is approved to deliver EFS across multiple regions, the EFS commencing students allocation will be split across the regional EFQ Financial Caps.
- For 2024-25, the EFQ Financial Caps will cover continuing students that commenced foundation skills qualifications in the EFQ program in 2023-24.
- The changes are reflected in version 13.3 of the NSW Skills List. The 22 qualifications currently delivered as EFS will have an expiry date of 30 June 2023. These same qualifications will see an EFQ program type identified as taking effect 1 July 2023.

b. When will this change occur?

• This change will be implemented for the start of the 2023-24 Activity Period, and be incorporated into the upcoming Smart and Skilled Provider Application round.

c. Who can apply to deliver foundation skills training? How do we apply?

- All providers (except non-government Enterprise-based RTOs) will be eligible to apply to deliver foundation skills full qualifications through the Smart and Skilled Provider Application, provided they have the relevant qualifications on their scope of registration.
- Providers interested in delivering foundation skills full qualifications training should select the relevant foundation skills qualifications from the EFQ program when completing their application for students commencing from 1 July 2023.

d. How will allocations be determined?

 Allocations will be determined using the NSW Market Assessment, the results of the assessment of RTO applications, and consideration of the previous EFS Financial Caps allocated and utilised by current Smart and Skilled Providers (where applicable).

e. Will training remain fee-free for eligible Smart and Skilled students?

 Foundation skills full qualification training will remain fee-free for all eligible Smart and Skilled students.

2. NSW SKILLS LIST UPDATED - VERSION 13.3

The NSW Skills List has been updated. This update covers changes as a result of:

- · updates to Training Packages; and
- updates to Vocational Training Orders (VTOs).

- Public Sector.

d. Qualifications with conditions to improve student outcomes

The Department has updated the NSW Skills List following consultation on 16 qualifications that were identified as having poor student outcomes.

Updates include adding targeted conditions to eight qualifications to improve their outcomes, removing one qualification and keeping the remaining seven with no conditions.

All qualifications with conditions can be identified on Version 13.3 of the NSW Skills List using the Strategy column.

e. Skilling for Recovery

Smart and Skilled Updates No. 180 and No. 186 (signalled that JobTrainer/Skilling for Recovery (SfR) will end on **31 December 2022.**

Smart and Skilled Update No. 180 also advised of further investments in fee free full qualifications beyond JobTrainer under Smart and Skilled. This will include all cohorts who are eligible for JobTrainer/SfR continuing to be eligible to access full qualifications on the current SfR approved list fee free for a further six months, i.e. for enrolments between 1 January 2023 to 30 June 2023.

For this reason, the Skills List will continue to reflect these qualifications under the Skilling for Recovery branding until 30 June 2023.

3. APPLY NOW FOR THE SMART AND SKILLED 2023-24 PROGRAM

Applications for the Smart and Skilled 2023-24 program are now being accepted. Any registered training organisation (RTO) that wants to be considered for the Smart and Skilled 2023-24 program needs to apply. The application process will be open from 1 November 2022 until 5pm 30 November 2022. Please note that no late applications will be accepted. Please be advised all Aboriginal controlled RTOs will be considered to be Established NSW RTOs.

More information about the Smart and Skilled application process for the 2023-24 program, and resources including the Market Management Policy Part B, NSW RTO Classification List and portal user guides can be found on our Smart and Skilled program 2023-24.

RTOs are encouraged to regularly check the Smart and Skilled webpages for updates.

For an RTO's application to be considered, the following must be completed:

- All financial viability assessment documentation must have been sent to Equifax and payment submitted.
- All of the required application documentation included when an application is submitted via the Smart and Skilled application portal.

Please allow time to complete the application well before the closing date. RTOs are strongly encouraged to begin the application as soon as possible.
