# 2. CURRENT ARRANGEMENTS REGARDING CERTIFIED DOCUMENTS WHEN ENROLLING STUDENTS UNDER SMART AND SKILLED

We understand that in the current COVID-19 context, it may not be possible for students to certify some documents deemed to be acceptable evidence under Appendix 3 (Proof of Eligibility – Acceptable Evidence) of the *Smart and Skilled Fee Administration Policy*.

For example, students may not able to go out to get copies of birth certificates, drivers licenses or other evidence verified by a person who is on the list of approved witnesses to verify documents due to social distancing or any other Government policies in relation to COVID-19.

During COVID-19, you should make reasonable judgements on the documentation provided by students and should not exclude students from enrolling purely on the basis that some copies of documents have not been certified under the current circumstances.

However, you must continue to keep detailed records and you may be required to ask students for verified documents once the COVID-19 situation has passed.
