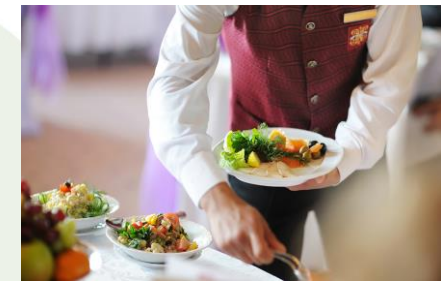

- Feedback will be reviewed by the Massage Therapy TAC and Complementary Health IRC to inform the development of the Final Draft.

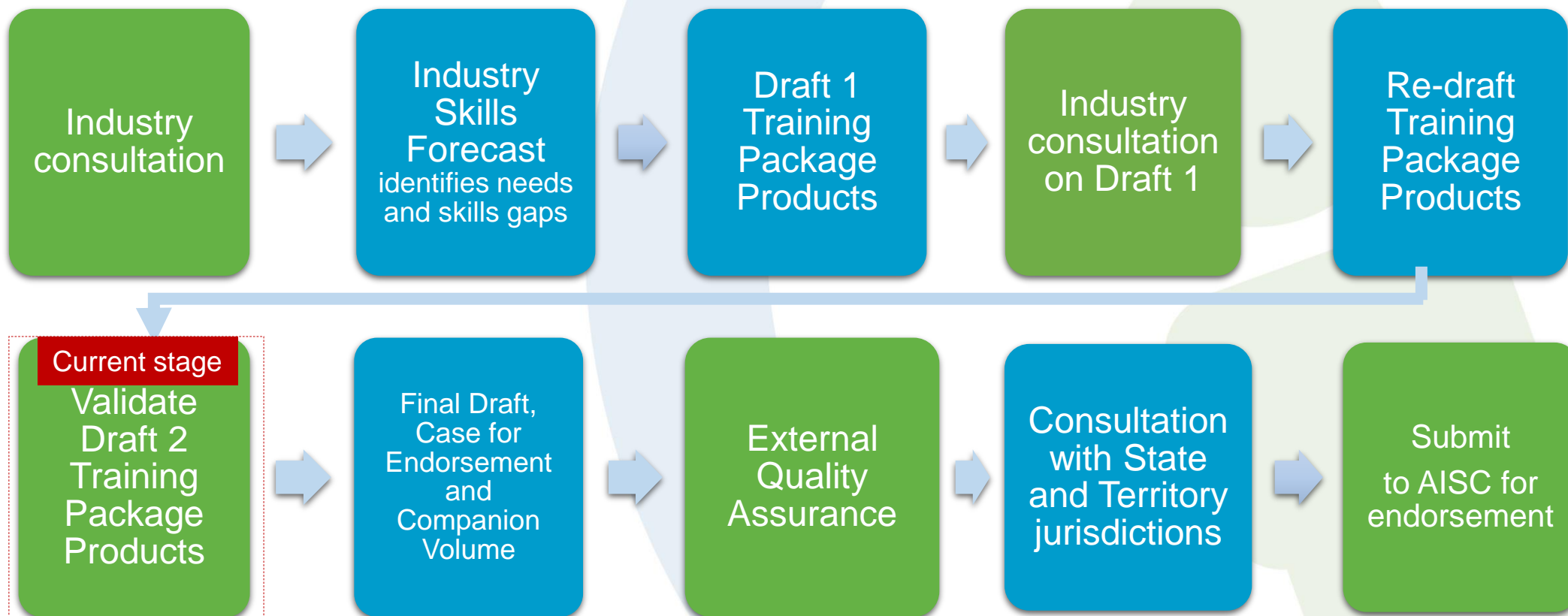


