

Draft 1 Key Changes – Qualifications

Draft 1 Qualifications have been updated in terms of:

- Packaging Rules Units to be completed
 - Core the list of core Units has been updated to better reflect the current skills and knowledge required by a Massage Therapist
 - Electives the list of elective Units has been updated to better reflect the current skills and knowledge required by a Massage Therapist, and provides skills such as:
 - Research
 - Principles of pain
 - Social media ethics
 - Market, monitor and manage small business
 - Working with a variety of special-needs patients etc.



Existing Units of Competency

The eight current Units of Competency which have been updated in terms of content and Unit codes are as follows:

- HLTMSG001 Develop massage practice
- HLTMSG002 Assess client massage needs
- HLTMSG003 Perform remedial massage musculoskeletal assessments
- HTLMSG004 Provide massage treatments
- HTLMSG005 Provide remedial massage treatments
- HLTMSG006 Adapt remedial massage treatments to meet specific needs
- HLTMSG007 Adapt remedial massage practice for athletes
- HLTMSG008 Monitor and evaluate remedial massage treatments

- HLTMSG014 Adapt massage treatments to meet specific needs (Title change)
- HLTMSG015 Adapt massage practice for athletes
- HLTMSG016 Apply remedial massage clinical practice (Title change)
- HLTMSG017 Apply relaxation massage clinical practice (New)
- HLTMSG018 Understand the principles of pain neuroscience (New)

Units

Elements and Performance Criteria

- Do the Elements and Performance Criteria accurately describe what people do in Massage Therapy Practitioner job roles? If not, what could be added?
- Do the Performance Criteria adequately describe the level of proficiency?



Seeking Feedback from Industry Stakeholders on Draft 1 Units of Competency

Performance Evidence

- Would the types of Performance Evidence prove that a person is competent in all the Unit outcomes, including Performance Criteria, Foundation Skills and Knowledge?
- Is the suggested volume (sufficiency) of evidence appropriate? Too little, too much?
- Are the statements clear? Would assessors understand exactly what they must do?

Knowledge Evidence

- What is the essential knowledge required of an individual in order to perform the tasks described in the Performance Criteria? Is the Knowledge Evidence requirement specific enough?
- Is there anything which should be added or deleted?

Assessment Conditions

- Are the nominated environments appropriate?
- Are the statements clear? Would assessors understand what they must provide for assessment?
