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Units of Competency

- statements about the skills and knowledge a particular job function
- describe work outcomes
- logically describe stand-alone skills which are used in a work situation
- combined in different ways to align to different job roles


Units of Competency

- duplication removed
 o deleted, merged, newly created
- allows focus on planning and delivery 2 separate people
- gaps identified and filled
- consistent reference to sessions, lessons and programs



Performance Criteria

- more detail about nature of tasks and expected performance
- use of simpler workplace language
- re-ordered
- missing skills included





Foundation Skills

- include more detailed explanation
- address specific workplace requirement not explicit in unit
- relevant skills level for language, literacy, numeracy & employment skills



Knowledge Evidence updated

- missing required knowledge added
- more detail about the scope of knowledge required
- re-sequenced to follow the order of the content of the unit
- tailored to each unit reducing broad general statements
- clearer for trainers and assessors to understand

Performance Evidence

- clear, measurable and auditable
- detail on type and sufficiency of evidence
- consistent use of program and sessions
- number of client programs or sessions



Assessment Conditions

- Environment
 - \circ the workplace, or
 - a simulated workplace set up for the purpose of skills assessment.
- Resources
 - o equipment
 - \circ clients
 - o various paperwork

Assessment Conditions

SISCAQU022 Plan swimming lessons

Assessors must:

- satisfy the Standards for Registered Training Organisations' requirements for assessors, and
- have a collective period of at least two years' experience working as a swim teacher, where they have applied the skills and knowledge covered in this Unit of Competency; the two years' experience can incorporate full- and part-time experience.

 - 2 units from list below, elsewhere in the SIS Training Package, or from any other current Training Package or accredited course.

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
